We **OPPOSE** HB 939 - If passed, this bill would **prohibit a person from carrying a** firearm within 100 feet of a voting location, including a ballot drop box. The original text of this bill would have also prohibited a firearm in a vehicle that was within 100 feet of a voting location, but the bill was amended to eliminate that problem.

We **SUPPORT** HB 1171 - This bill requires more timely processing of returned mail absentee ballots than the law currently requires. This protects voters, ensuring they have enough time to correct any written errors on their ballot before it is time for ballots to be counted.

We **OPPOSE** SB 196 & HB 1534 - These bills would alter the procedure for challenging a voter registration. It would abolish the mechanism for a voter to challenge another voter's registration eligibility while at a polling place, shifting the responsibility of challenge oversight solely to the court system. In advocating for this, SB 196 and HB 1534 erect barriers that could impede the timely resolution of eligibility disputes. Registrars, who maintain up-to-date, accurate voter registration lists for their
